Brigadier General James K. Durham, U.S. Army (Ret) died May 27, 2008. He was born to James Ransom and Ellen Temple Durham of Johnston Country, North Carolina on August 6, 1919. The General graduated from Four Oaks High School in 1936.

His 38 years of service to his country has taken him from basic private in the Army on July 11, 1941, to commissioned officer on October 28, 1942, and was appointed by the President of the United States to General Officer and approved by Congress on February 28, 1973. General Durham retired from the Army in February 1979.

General Durham was on duty at an Army airfield near Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941 when the Japanese attack came. His medals and awards for his leadership and devotion to duty are numerous-from the Army Commendation Medal to Theater

Ribbons spanning two oceans with six major campaign battle stars. He participated in two major battle campaigns in the Asiatic-Pacific Theater and four major battle campaigns in the European Theater-from the invasion of the Normandy Beach Head in France to the end of World War II.

General Durham's education includes many technical schools in refrigeration and internal combustion engines prior to his entry into the service. He is a graduate of the Engineer Officers School, Fort Belvoir, VA, the Command and General Staff College, Fort Leavenworth, KS, and the U.S. Army War College at Carlisle Barracks, PA.
