Aged Man Goes to His Reward Funeral of Mr. Israel Stephenson Held at Primitive Baptist Church Here Friday

One of Johnston County's oldest men passed away Thursday afternoon at two o'clock, when Mr. Israel Stephenson died at his home near here after a long illness. Mr. Stephenson had been in feeble health for several years and was confined to his bed for three weeks before his death. If he had lived until April 2, he would have been eighty years old.
